

POLS 301: Politics and Travel Legacies of Colonialism MAY 2019

This two-week course allows students the opportunity to study the politics, history, and economy of South Asia through the lens of British colonialism, understanding the impact that British rule has had through to today. We will be spending the majority of our time in and around the capital of India, Delhi, a city which has been destroyed and rebuilt seven times throughout its history, which we will explore through historical and cultural excursions, arts and crafts expeditions, and visits to museums and UNESCO World Heritage sites.
