

Psychology of Alcohol and Culture

Explore the psychology of alcohol consumption and culture in Belgium (**Bruges**), the Netherlands (**Amsterdam**) and Germany (**Bamberg**). Examine cultural, psychological, biological, and historical aspects of alcohol. Visit cultural sites, breweries, museums, and a treatment center. Learn how physiology, taste perception, history, art, religion, and marketing relate to the psychology of alcohol. As these are historic brewing nations, we will examine the role of beer in each nation's culture. You will collaborate on research with European students in Bruges and Bamberg.

<u>Prerequisite</u>: Psych 201 *or* 202, completed by May 2019. Earns 3 credits toward Psychology major requirements, and is a 3-credit elective toward graduation requirements for non-majors. Open to all majors.

Costs included in \$3925 program fee:

- -International airfare from the United States (Dulles) and all transportation within Europe.
- -Lodging, breakfasts, minimum of three group dinners, trip health insurance policy.
- -All excursions, seminars, museum fees, admissions, and course activities (see below). New: bonus night in Dublin!

Costs not included in program fee:

- -Tuition: In-state or out-of-state tuition is in addition to program fee.
- -Most lunches/dinners, personal spending, textbook, passport, any additional baggage fees.

<u>Belgium</u>: Cultural exchange and research collaboration at the Atheneum school, Cantillon Museum of Gueuze, Brussels Grand Place, Groninge Museum, St Jans Hospital, Alcoholics Anonymous seminar, brewery visit, bike ride, canal tour. <u>Amsterdam</u>: Rjiksmuseum, Heineken Experience, House of Bols, Anne Frank House, nonprofit brewery occupational rehabilitation, Van Gogh Museum, Red Light District, windmill bike-culture trip.

<u>Germany</u>: Cultural exchange and research collaboration at University of Bamberg, Bamberg Dom Cathedral, Schlenkerla Brewery, Altenburg Castle, traditional biergarden.
